Q2. What drives you to run as a candidate in the local body elections? What do you hope to achieve?

Q4. What will you do to support the development of seasonal worker housing, especially in rural areas?

Council does not supply housing, and what they do though, is enforce legislation that is set by Central Government. We are working with Central Government to get better outcomes for housing.

Q5. How will you ensure kiwifruit growers have reliable access to water, and how will you balance competing demands?

Typically in rural areas, kiwifruit growers do not use town supplied water. They typically have storage tanks or dams that they access. From a District Councils view, we will always make sure that the sources that they are using complys with the standards.

Personally I am very much for protecting horticultural land. That is why we have set out rules for devlopementing in areas.

Q7. How will you improve rural road infrastructure to support the movement of produce?

Our rural roads are vital to keeping our district produce moving. We are now investing 69% of every dollar towards infrastructure, and roading has received the biggest investment.
